

Church Financial Overview

What Happened in March and Year-to-date: General giving to the church for operating needs (missions, utilities, up-keep, staff salary and expenses, etc.) was down again for the second month in a row. However, expenses were less than income, continuing that positive situation. For this fiscal year, our financial posture continues to be better than last year - now with an important challenge to sustain this through the final quarter.
