The Food Pantry at Central College Church serves **40 families per week**. **Over 40%** of the individuals served are **children**. Each family gets enough food to last at least 5 days and a family can request food twice a month from the Food Pantry.

This equals **10,000 meals per month**. The food for the Food Pantry comes from several sources. About 80% of the food is purchased from the Mid-Ohio Foodbank at reduced prices or for free. The remainder comes from congregation members, the Academy, the Pre-School, Scouts, other schools, grocery stores and restaurants.

Six bags of groceries would cost a family of four approximately \$120. Through the Mid Ohio Foodbank and contributions that cost is \$18.00.

It takes 75 volunteers a month to make feeding thousands happen. In total, the Food Pantry distributes over 15,000 lbs of food each month.



This mission requires the help of many dedicated volunteers to keep the Food Pantry running.

There are 4 types of volunteer opportunities as follows:



- 1 When the Mid-Ohio truck brings food to the Food Pantry, a number of volunteers unload the pallets of food and properly store them on the marked shelves and in the refrigerator or freezers.

Frequency: *every other Monday afternoon for 1½ – 2 hours.*

- 2 The second type of volunteering is helping to pickup produce, bakery goods and other food each Monday morning at Mid-Ohio Foodbank for 2 hours. Additional volunteers are needed to unload the van at the pantry, sort produce and stock the shelves with produce and food.

Frequency: *Every Monday morning for 2+ hours*

- 3 A third type of volunteer is the people who bag the groceries. A family of four receives 4 bags of canned and boxed goods, a refrigerator bag and a freezer bag. Each volunteer generally bags the food for 4 families.

Frequency: *1-2 times per month for 2+ hours, evening or during the day.*

- 4 The fourth type of volunteer is the evening representative who gives the food bags to the clients each day and gets the appropriate paperwork signed.

Frequency: *once per week from 4:30–6pm, Monday through Friday.*
